CLEANING INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Treads should be swept with a broom or vacuumed with a heavy-duty commercial vacuum cleaner at least once a week.
- 2. When needed, scrub surface vigorously with a stiff bristled brush using a mild detergent, making sure it **does not** contain Sodium Hydroxide or Potassium Hydroxide. We suggest using Murphy's Oil Soap® or Simple Green®. Rinse thoroughly with water after cleaning. The excess water can then be picked up with a sponge mop to eliminate any film left on the tread surface. Let air dry.
- 3. Scuff marks on the aluminum nose can be removed by rubbing with a fine steel wool and a commercial cleaning agent.
- 4. To remove snow and ice use Sodium Chloride salt.
- 5. To remove chewing gum from abrasive surface of treads, scrape off as much excess chewing gum as possible with a putty knife. Soak with a commercial agent if gum is difficult to remove. Repeat several times if necessary. Scrub vigorously. Finish the job by cleaning the tread with Murphy's Oil Soap®, stiff brush, clean water and a sponge to remove excess liquid from tread surface.
